## Arrival Procedure

Eurocamp Independent customers should go straight to the campsite reception on arrival, where they will be required to fill in a registration form. Reception, where English is spoken, is open from 7.30am to 10pm all season. Customers unavoidably delayed, arriving after the barrier is down (10pm to 7.30am) should leave the car outside the site and go to the main campsite reception to speak to security or to the bar to find a member of staff. We advise that you ring ahead to warn the campsite if you expect to arrive late.

As Eurocamp couriers (on site from 25th April to 26th September) will be unaware of your arrival, we recommend that you visit their reception tent as soon as you have settled in. Please take your completed courier card with you.

Please note – if you have booked an overnight stop in a mobile home or ready erected tenet please see the special arrival procedure on your accommodation voucher.

# Life On Site

A traditional site set in the grounds of an Austrian Gasthof and equipped with first class facilities. The breathtaking scenery of the Tirol mountains will create a lasting impression.

## Useful Information

- **Swimming pool:** There is a small outdoor heated pool and children's pool on the campsite. Both are open from early May to the end of September. There is also a private lake (accessible via an underpass) which is suitable for swimming. A wellness area is available on site which, for an additional cost, offers access to a sauna, Turkish bath, Kneipp bath and spa services and is open from April to November.
- **Washblocks:** There are three sanitary blocks on the campsite, which are all clearly separated for Ladies and Gentlemen. Please note that most campsites do not provide toilet paper in the wash blocks, and some campsite sanitary blocks do not have toilet seats.
- **Barbecues:** Gas, charcoal and electric barbecues are all allowed on your pitch.
- **Internet access:** Internet access is available in reception and the campsite's shop. WiFi is also available with coverage over most of the site.
- **Gas bottles:** These can be exchanged on site.
- **Motorhome service point:** There is a motorhome service point on site.
- **Fridge hire:** This is not available on site. However it is possible to freeze ice packs at no cost.
- **Electricity:** There will be a 16 amp, 3 pin standard European electricity connection on your pitch.
- **Dogs:** A maximum of two dogs are allowed on your pitch, as long as they are kept on a lead. Please note that dogs are not allowed near the lake area of the site. If you require any up to date information on taking your dog abroad, please get in touch. We would be happy to book any necessary vets appointments on your behalf.

## Campsite Activities and Entertainment

We have picked out a few things to do on site that may be of interest to you. For a full list of campsite activities, please refer to our brochure or website.

### During the day

**Cycle hire** – is available on site all season. Electric bikes, mountain bikes and standard adult bikes are available for hire per day as well as bikes for children. Baby seats are also available for hire.

**Canoeing** – canoe hire is available on the site's own lake all Season. There is no cost for hiring the canoes but the paddles need to be obtained from the Eurocamp Reception.

**Football** – A half sized pitch is available to play on.

**Guided hiking and mountain biking** – tours for all levels of ability.

**Gym** – with weights and exercise machines and fitness instructors.

**Horse riding** – there are stables close by. Small children can ride on ponies round the site but this needs to be organised through the children's club (please note helmets are not available on site).

**Mini golf** – large mini-golf course with 12 different routes through a mini golf course (open mid June to mid September).

**Tennis** – there are 3 courts available and lessons can be booked.

**Animation** The campsite runs a children's club, from mid May to mid September, for children age 4 to 12, with arts, crafts, picnics and games. There is also a Sports Rep who organizes free sporting activities, guided walks and cycling tours.

### During the evening

In high season there are weekly Austrian evenings, karaoke, barbecues, live music events and dances.

### Excursions

The campsite does not organise any excursions

## Food and Drink

There is an attractive restaurant on site, with its own well stocked wine cellar, serving traditional Austrian specialities and international delicacies. In addition to evening meals, it is also possible to enjoy a hearty breakfast buffet here to start off your day. As well as a formal seating area, there is a cosy bar with an open log fire where you can listen to live music. Outside, there is a sun terrace. Take-away facilities are also available, typically offering Pizza, Schnitzel and Chips. These facilities are open all year although opening times can vary.

## Shopping

There is a small shop on site, selling general groceries and basic everyday necessities. The shop is only open from late April to the start of September.

# Around & About

Set 500m from the village of Bruck an der Großglocknerstraße and 5km from the pretty lakeside town of Zell am See, you are ideally placed for exploring this lovely region of Austria. Close at hand is the Hohe Tauern National Park, established in 1981, this is the largest nature reserve in the Alps and covers the high mountains of Großglockner and Großvenediger, glaciers and spectacular waterfalls.

## While you're here try...

### PALATSCHINKE

The Austrian version of the Crêpe, it is somewhat thicker than the French counterpart and is usually served filled with jam or quark.

### SACHER TORTE

Created in 1832, the Sacher Torte must be one of the most famous chocolate cakes in the world today.

### WACHAUER MARILLENKNÖDEL

Traditional apricot dumplings

### TIROLER GRÖSTEL

A stir-fried mix of meat, potatoes, onions and herbs, often served in a heavy cast iron pan.

## Beaches

The focal point of Zell am See is the lake; it offers a full range of watersports and areas of grass stretch right down to the water's edge and are ideal for sunbathing. Please note, most of the lakeside beaches here make a small charge.

## Where to Shop

- **Bruck** – The local town (500m away). There is a full range of shops here including banks, a chemist, a supermarket and post office.
- **Zell am See** – This town (5km away) offers a wider choice of shops. Typical souvenirs to look for include carved wooden items, table cloths, aprons and painted glassware.
- **Saalfelden** – This large town (24kms away) offers three hypermarkets and should accommodate most of your needs.

**Local market days** (usually mornings only) are as follows:

Thursday – Bruck for a 'Bauernmarkt' (traditional farmers' market).

Friday – Zell am See 5km.

## Sporting Activities

- **Golf** – the Golf club Zell am See-Kaprun (5km) offers two 18 hole championship courses in a fantastic setting.
- **Windsurfing** – 5km, Windsurfing Heinz Seidl; Zell am See; Tel: 06542551155; office@windsurfcenter.info
- **Water rafting and Canyoning** – 11km on the river Saalzach at Taxenbach.
- **Hiking** – the local mountain, the Schmittenhöhe is located on the outskirts of Zell am See and there are many hiking trails to explore.
- **Summer skiing** – at Kaprun 6km. The glacier skiing area here, at an altitude of 2,900m, allows skiing for 10 months of the year.
- **Dry toboggan run** – at Saalfelden 20km. A 1,600m toboggan experience with 63 curves, for ages 6 and above. Please note this does not run when it is raining.
- **Fishing** – in the Zeller See and the Saalzach. Permits (available from the local tourist office) are required.

## Must Sees and Dos

### Zell am See funicular - 5km

Take the easy route to the ski resort of Kaprun which is located at the foot of the Kitzsteinhorn.

### Großglockner Pass - 7km

Take a trip into the highest mountain in Austria. The Großglockner Hochalpen (High Alpine) road (closed in winter to the beginning of May, depending on weather conditions), takes you into the heart of the national park. Take in the spectacular scenery on a 48km of high road with 36 bends and an altitude ascent to 2,504m. Please the road is a toll road (32 euros in 2012 for a one day ticket), but this includes entry to the Visitor Centres and Exhibitions.

### Ferleiten Wildlife and Recreation park - 7km

A 15 hectare park with more than 200 animals, including bears, wolves, wild boars and birds of prey. There are also fantastic panoramic views of one of the most beautiful valleys in the Alps.

### Schmittenhöhe mountain and cable car - 8km

This beautiful mountain rises to 1,967m to the west of Zell am See. The panoramic views from the top are among the finest in the Kitzbühel Alps and take in the glacial peaks of the Grossglockner range. There are four different routes up the mountain and in the summer the hardy have been known to climb it in 4 hours. The easier option though is to take the cable car to the middle station and from there one of the lifts to the upper platform and sun terrace. Allow at least 2 hours for the round trip plus another 20 minutes for the cable car.

### Sonnalm cablecar - 17km

The Sonnalm cablecar (entrance near the Schmittenhöhe terminus) rises up the side of Sonnalm at 1,386m to a restaurant perched on the top. From Sonnalm, it's possible to go by chairlift to Sonnkogel (1,836m) and by surface lift to Hochmais (1,728m).

### Krimmler Waterfalls - 55km

A 4km long hiking trail, with numerous vantage points and viewing platforms, enables you to get very close to these waterfalls. With a fall height of 380m, these are the fifth highest waterfalls in the world and are enjoyed by over 350,000 visitors each year.

### Underground caves

There are many cave systems in the area open to the public for example at Leogang 27km and Weissbach 34km.

### Salzburg – 94km

The city is the birthplace of Mozart and is a cultural and architectural delight. The Fortress Hohensalzburg towers over the town and is well worth a visit, or you can tour the film locations of The Sound of Music.

# Getting To Your Site

**Location** Sportcamp Woferlgut is situated in the village of Bruck.

**Directions** From Italy: Take the A22 motorway, following signs for Brennero. Continue along this road until you reach Austria, here you will have to buy a 'vignette', for a small charge, which lasts for 10 days and allows you to drive on the motorway. Follow Innsbruck/ München/ A13. You will then have to drive across the Brenner Pass, (toll road). Continue on the A12 motorway towards 'Salzburg/ München'. Exit at 'Lofer/ St. Johann/ Brixental/ Wörgl- Ost'. At the 'T' junction take a left-hand turn for 'St. Johann/ Lofer/ Brixental' on the 312. Follow the signs for 'Kitzbühel' and then for 'Pass Thurn' (161). Once over the 'Pass Thurn' follow for 'Zell-am-See'. As you approach 'Zell-am-See', follow the road up the bridge (do not go through the tunnel) in the direction of 'Bruck an der Grosse Glocknerstrasse'. Go straight on at the roundabout (Billa supermarket on your right) and you will join a dual carriage way after about 500 metres. Take the exit after the A1 petrol station (Bruck, Grosse Glockner). Turn left at the T junction direction Bruck and after the Billa supermarket take the left turn following signs for Sportcamp Woferlgut. The site is on this road on the left hand side.

## New Law re Breathalysers in France

Please be aware there is a new law coming in to force from 1st July 2012 that makes it COMPULSORY for all motorists in FRANCE to carry a single use breathalyser. We advise that if you are travelling to (or through) France you should carry at least two disposable breathalysers in order to comply with this new law. The breathalysers you purchase must comply to French regulations and will carry the 'French certification mark' 'NF'. These should be purchased prior to departure in the UK but can also be purchased on the ferry, in most French supermarkets, service/petrol stations or chemists. You could receive an on-the-spot fine if you cannot produce this product when asked.
